FROM NACOG ON HOME WEATHERIZATION

NACOG is working to provide cost effective, energy saving weatherization sevices to low and moderate income families throughout Apache, Coconino, Navajo, and Yavapai counties to help reduce utility costs and carbon footprint.

To be eligible for Weatherization assistance, applicants must meet the following DOE annual income requirements:

Family size	Maximum annual income
1	\$24,120
2	\$32,480
3	\$40,840
4	\$49,200

For each additional household member add \$8,360.

WEATHERIZATION CONTINUED..

To be eligible for Weatherization Assistance, the residence must also meet one or more of the following requirements:

*Be existing and presently occupied by an eligible owner or renter.

*Must not have been previously weatherized with DOE funds.

*Mobiles are eligible, but skirting is not allowed.

* Rental units are eligible with written approval from owner or landlord.

* Funds may not be used to weatherize a residence that is vacant or designated for clearance or acquisition within 12 months.

* Residences that are for sale are NOT eligible.

Weatherization is about:

* Saving you money on your utility bills.

* Achieving the right air flow balance in a house so that it's not too leaky or too stuffy.

* Verifying the usefulness and safety of certain household equipment.

* Energy efficiency!

Our town was recently notified that we are the recipient of a \$ 176,400 grant for our swimming pool. The Land and Water Conservation Fund grant was awarded through the National Park Service. Also the Tribe has given us a grant of \$30,000 for the swimming pool. We are so excited for these grants and also thankful towards these entities for the grants they have given us. So far about \$300,000 has been raised towards the new swimming pool.

KAIBAB NATIONAL FOREST TO OFFER CHRISTMAS TREE PERMITS!

Kaibab national forest is offering Christmas tree permits starting November 16th; fourth graders eligible for free permit with every Kid in a Park Pass.

The Kaibab National Forest will sell over-the-counter and through the mail Christmas tree tags on a first come, first served basis for each of its three ranger districts beginning Nov. 16th and continuing until they are sold out. The \$15 permit will allow the holder to cut a tree of any species that is not more than 10 feet in height with in a designated area on the Kaibab National Forest from Nov. 16th thru Dec. 24th. The tag is only good for a tree on the ranger district from which it was purchased and can't be used to cut a tree on a different district unless specifically noted. No refunds will be made, even if weather conditions prevent access to cutting areas. Individuals who purchase tags will be provided with a map showing their designated area along with tree cutting instructions. 8am to 4:30pm Monday thru Friday at the Fredonia, AZ - 3
