## Town of Fredonia, Arizona

### Gateway to the Canyons

The Grand Canyon National Park, located in northern Arizona, encompasses 277 miles (446 km) of the Colorado river and adjacent uplands. Water for the Grand Canyon National Park comes from Roaring Spring, some 1,500 feet below the North Rim of the park. It falls through the pipeline along Bright Angel Creek to Phantom Ranch then up to Indian Garden where it is pumped to storage tanks on the South Rim. Water is also pumped from Roaring Spring to Cottonwood Campground and the Manzanita Rest Area on the northside of the Bright Angel Trail.

The Transcanyon Water Pipeline opened in 1965 and was designed to last for 40 years. The park itself is conducting an environmental assessment as part of a project to replace the Transcanyon Water Pipeline by 2020.

The pipeline leaks regularly and has serious breaks each year that often force repair shut downs. Pipeline breaks in the remote canyon that is only accessible by helicopter or trail, can take days or weeks to repair. There have been more than 80 pipeline breaks since 2010. Some breaks were repaired in September. So when going to these places mentioned before and always carry water and try to carry water treatments if necessary to treat water.

## 2017 Basketball Registration

Basketball signups for both boys and girls are underway. Final registrations are due by October 13th. You can return the registration form and the money to the school, the town office, or any member of the Youth Sports Committee. Normally two registrations are done, but this year in order to get all of our junior Jazz jerseys on time, we are registering all at once. All teams will be split in mid-October.

The boys teams will begin practicing at that time. We are looking for a coach for the 3rd & 4th grade team, and an assistant coach for the 5th-6th grade team. The 5th– 8th grad boys will practice together. Their games will be held in November and December.

The girls 5th-8th grades will begin practicing around the boys schedule. Times will be determined. We are looking for an assistant coach with a child in the 5th-6th grade to help on game days. These practices will focus on teaching fundamentals such as dribbling, passing, and shooting. Their games will be held in January and February.

The cost for playing basketball is \$30 per player. The Youth Sports Committee are committed to providing youth sports to all youth regardless fo their financial situation. If you feel that you are unable to pay the required \$30 registration fee, we have options available. You can submit an installment plan and make payments you can afford or we have limited scholarships for families who demonstrate a need. Both forms will be available at the town office. All application information will be kept 100% confidential. The scholarship applications will be reviewed and approved by the Youth Sports Committee. All registrations must have payment, a payment plan, or a scholarship application in order to be complete. We will not be accepting incomplete registrations.
